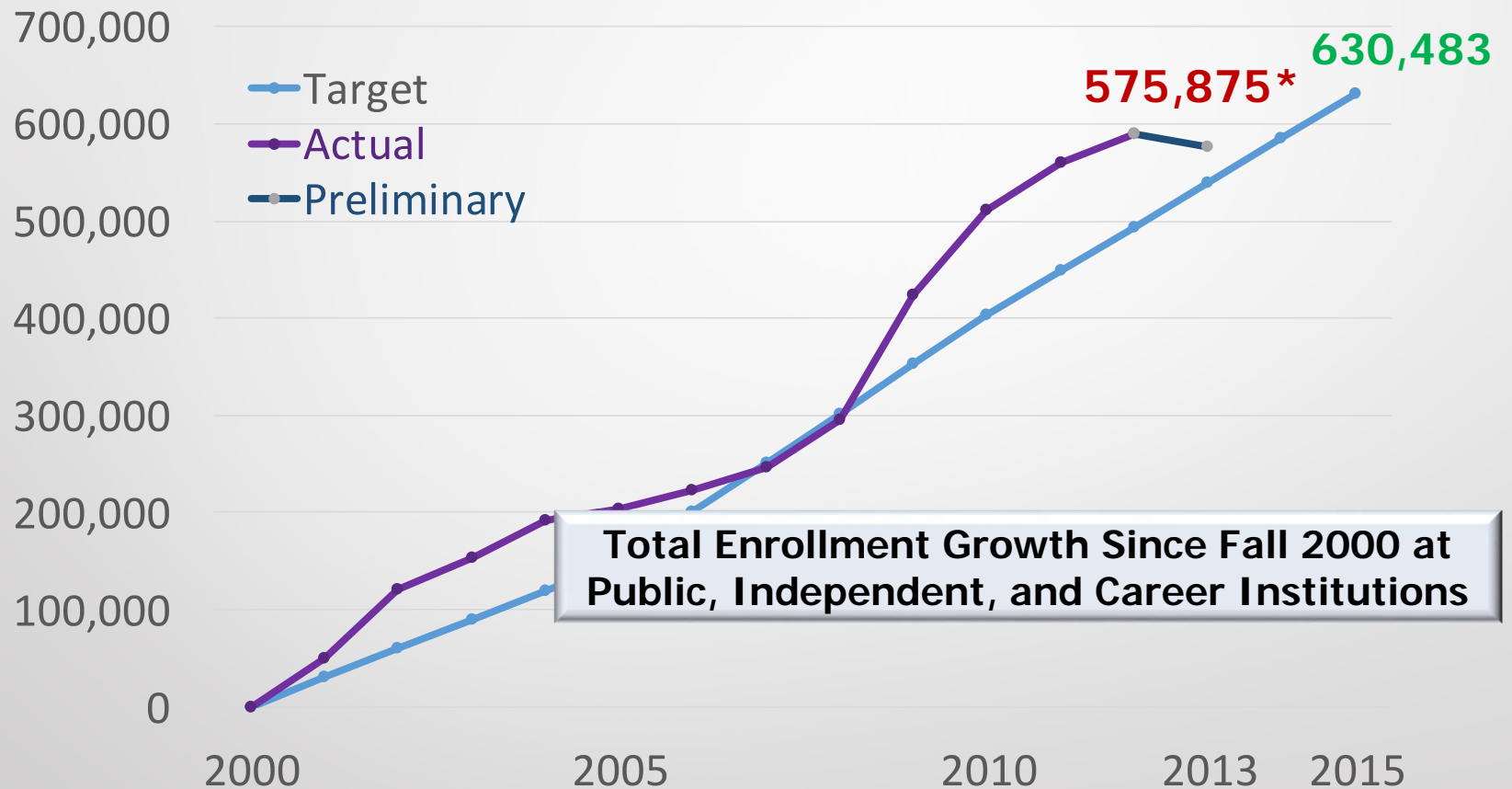

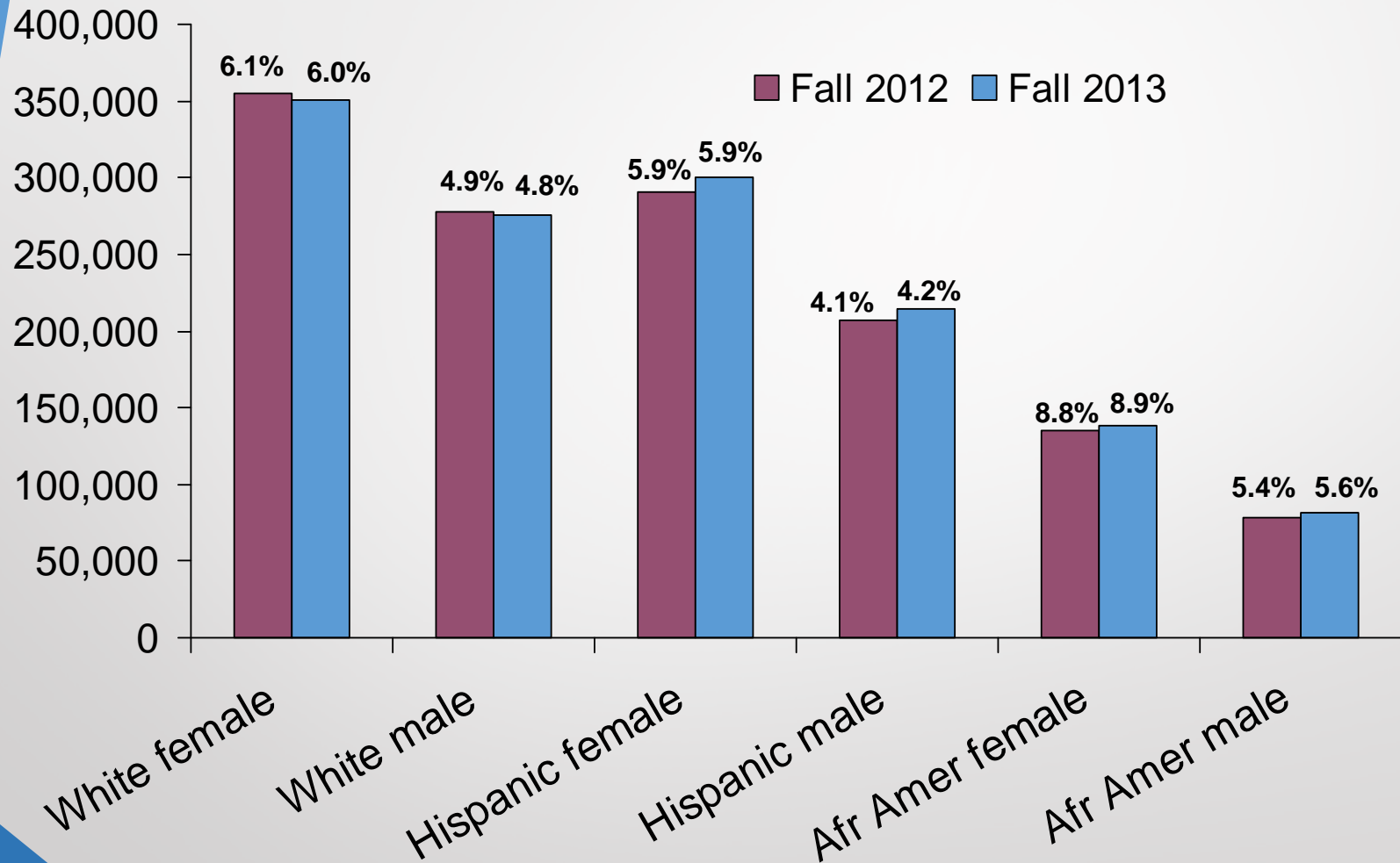
Texas needs **55,000 additional students** to reach 2015 goal for participation



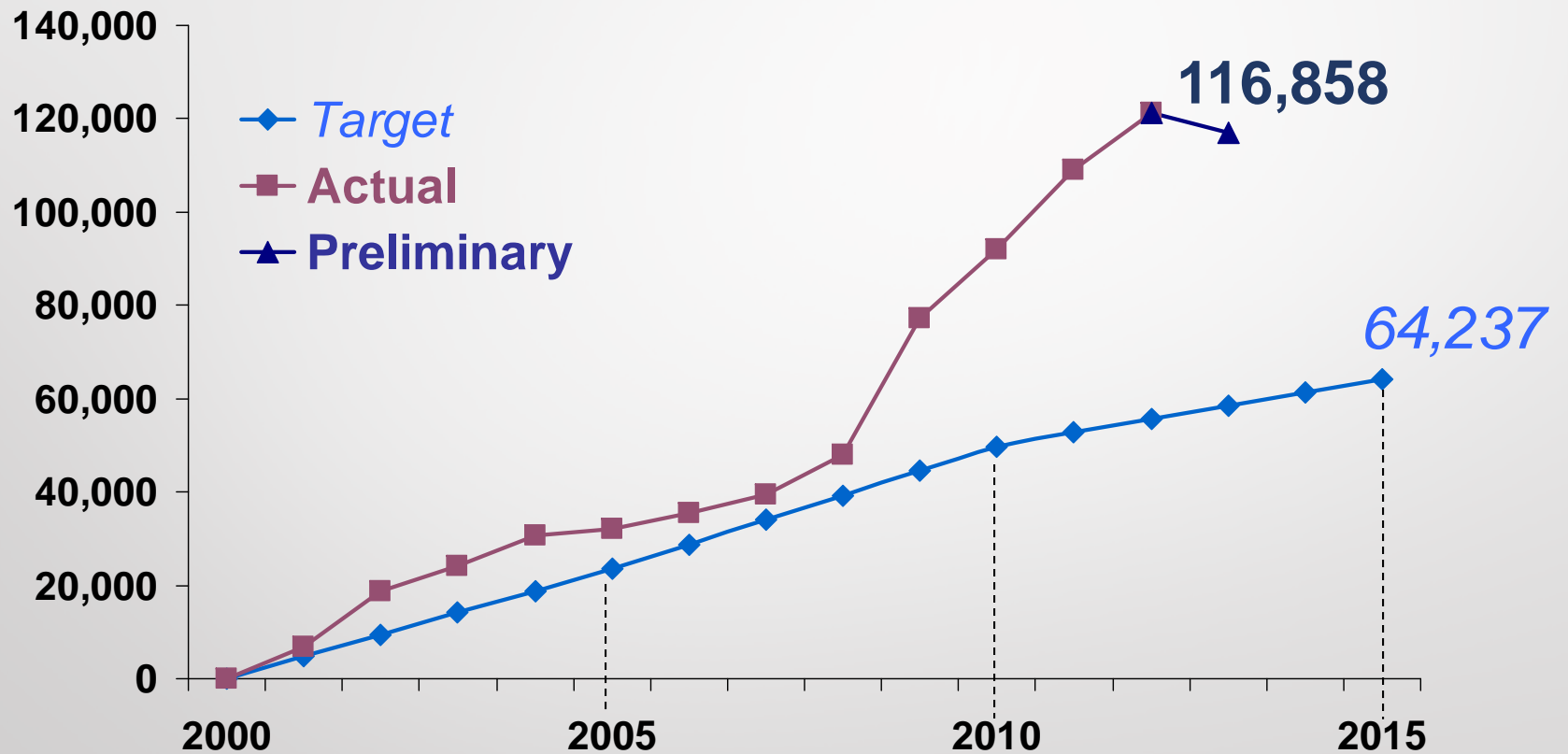
Total Enrollment Growth Since Fall 2000 at Public, Independent, and Career Institutions

Females continue to enroll at higher rates than males

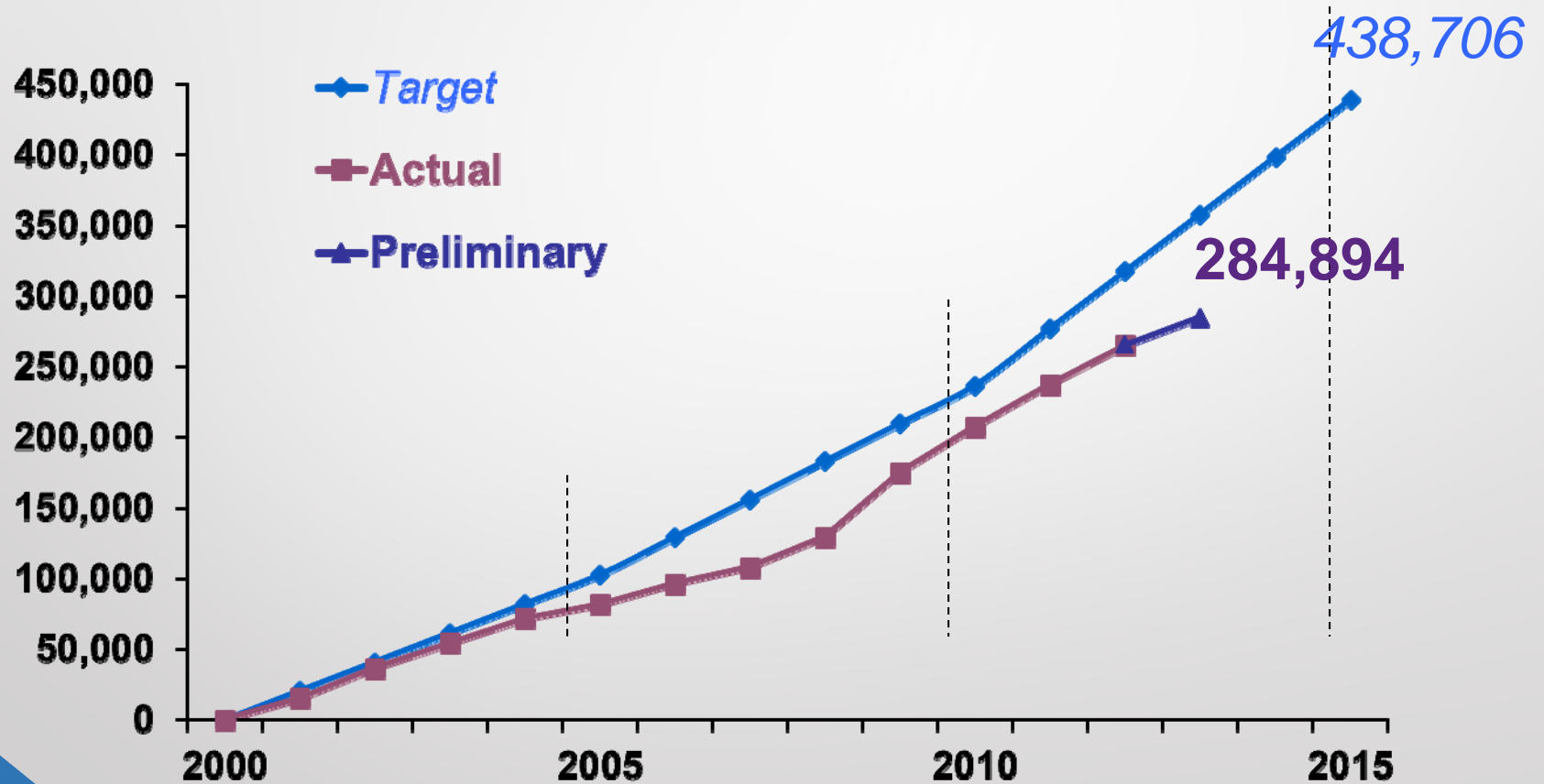


African American enrollment growth has far outpaced the target

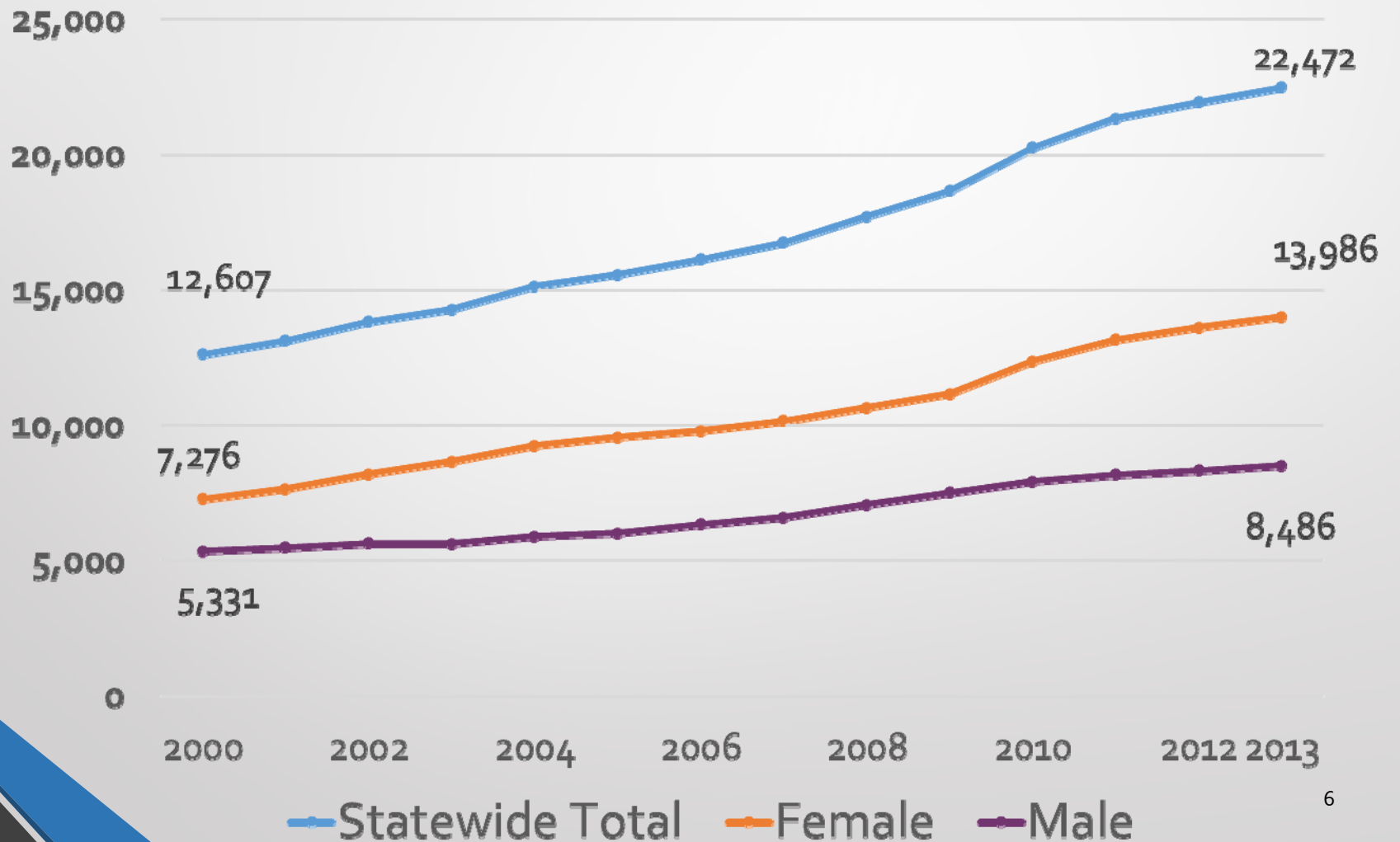


* 2013 Preliminary – includes Public, Independent, Career and Flex-entry

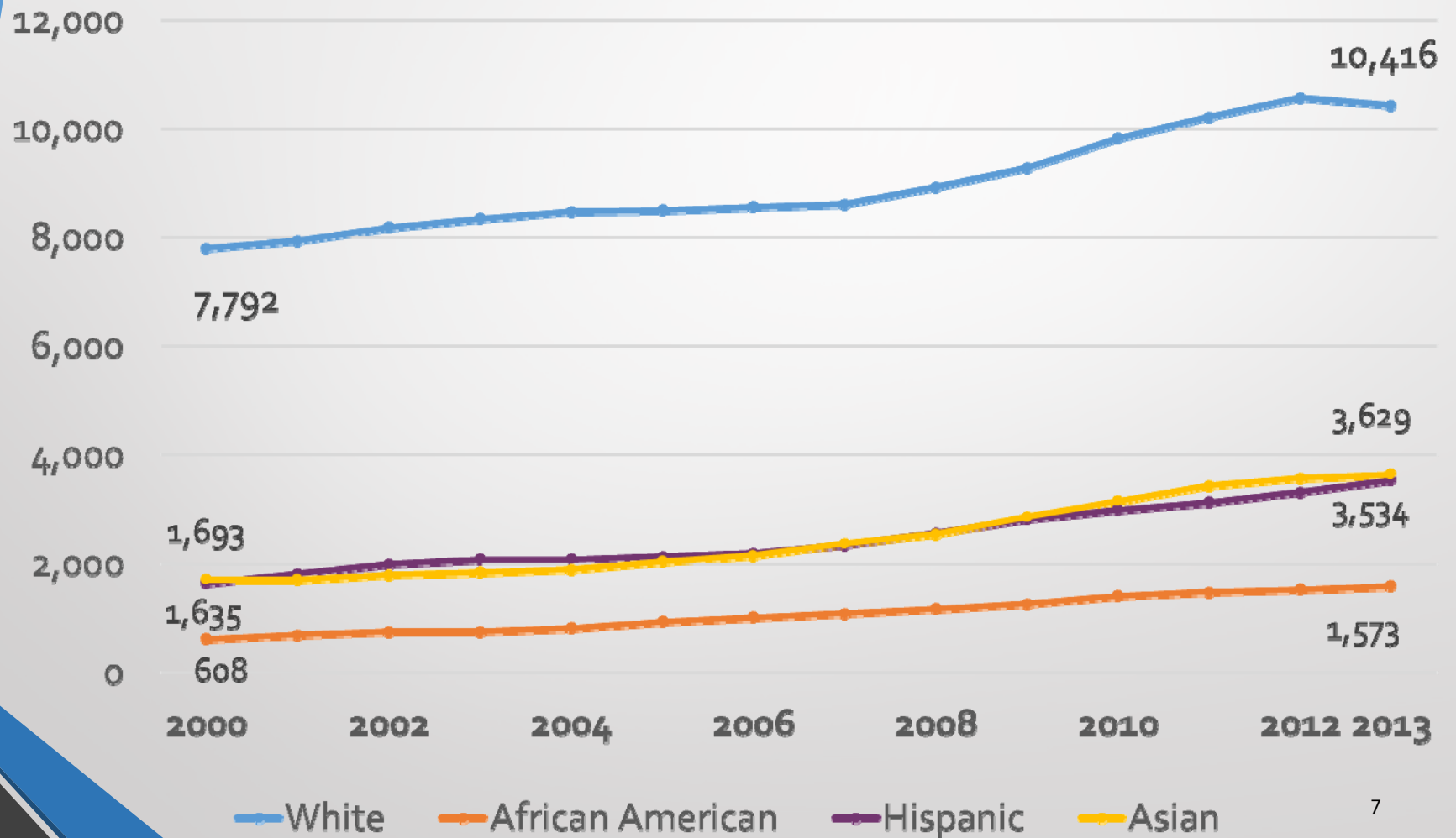
Even with large increases, Hispanic enrollment growth does not meet the target



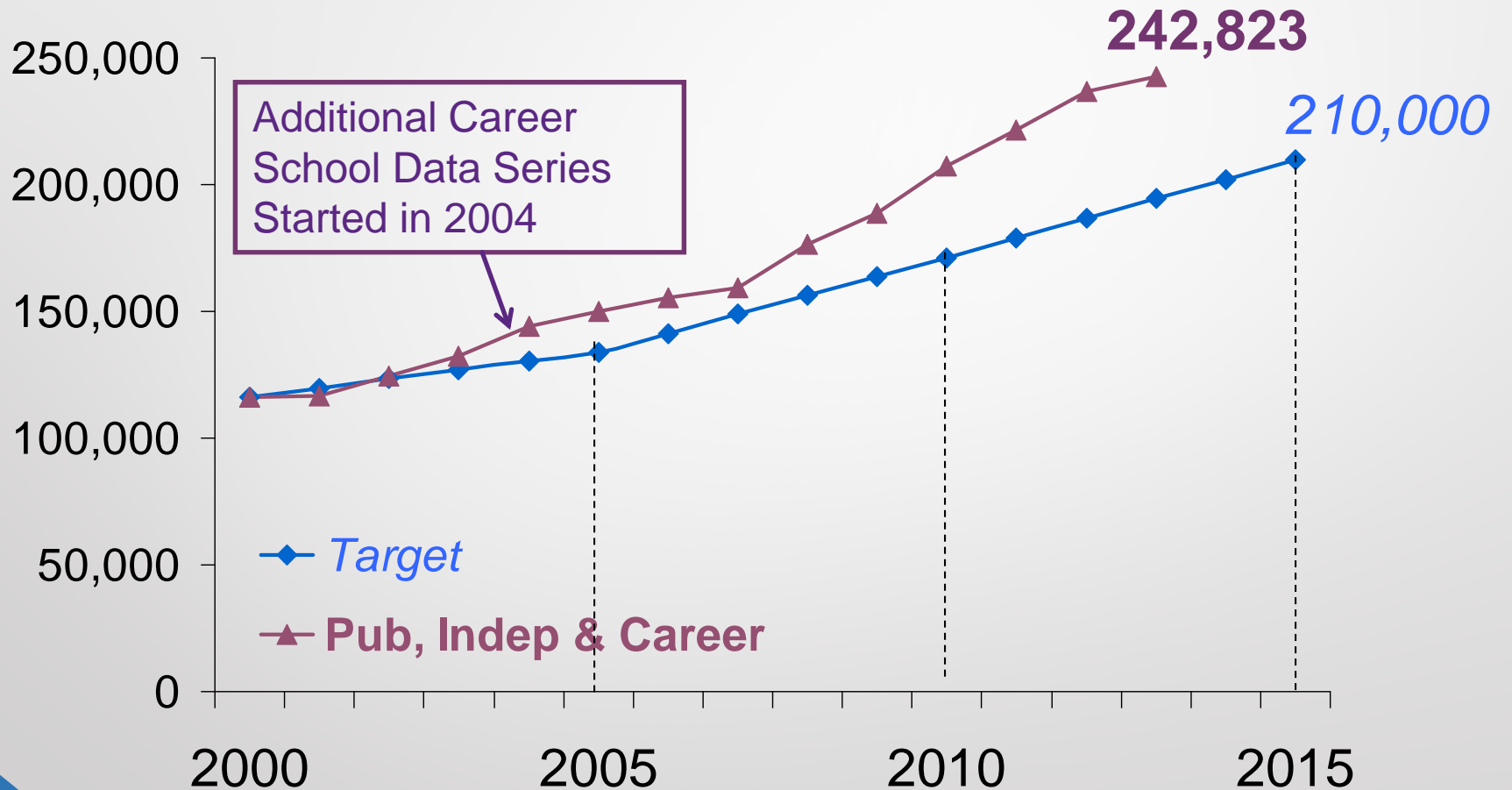
Growth has been strong at HRIs



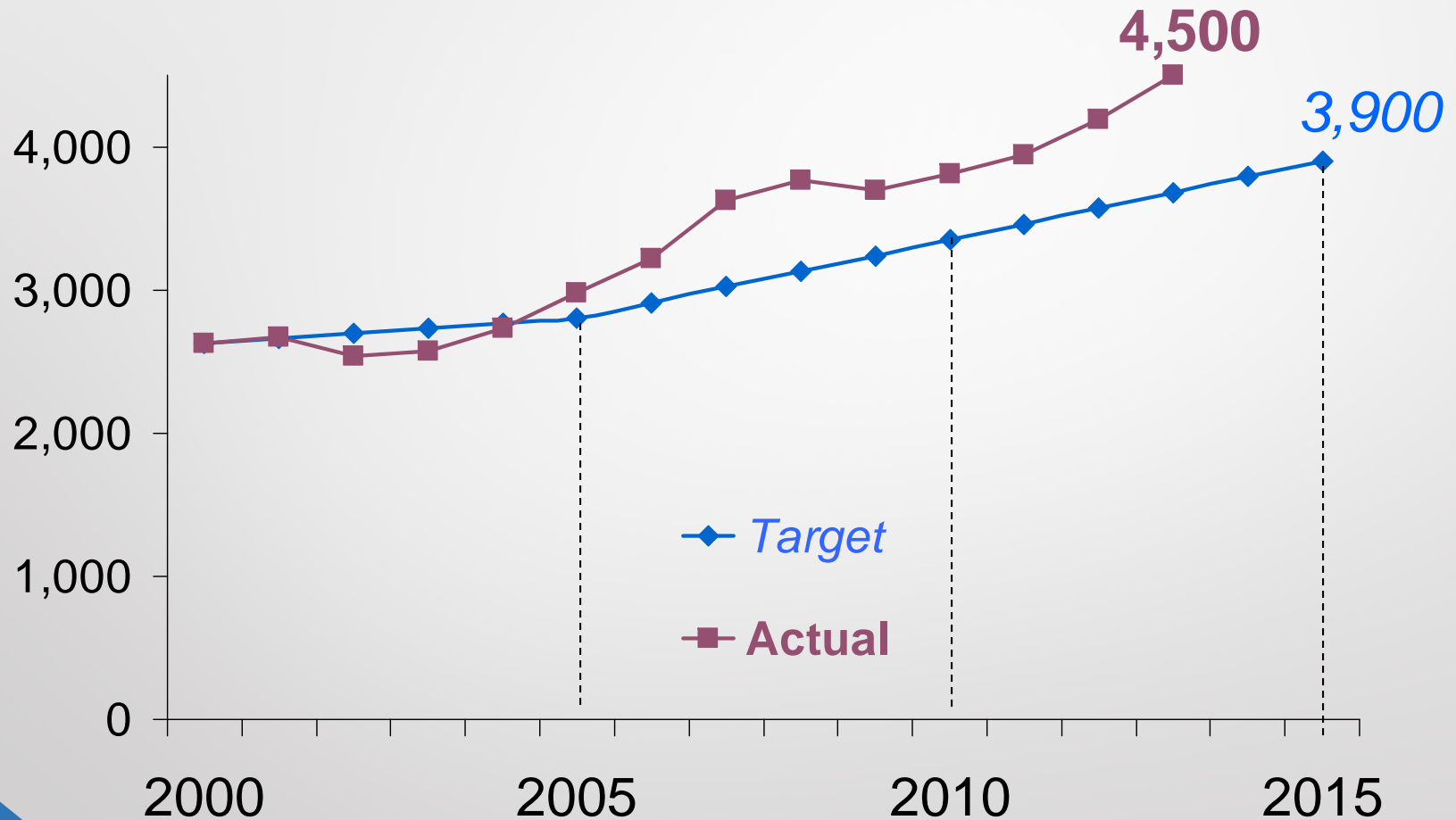
White HRI population declined in 2013; other HRI populations continued upward trend



Texas has surpassed the target for undergraduate awards

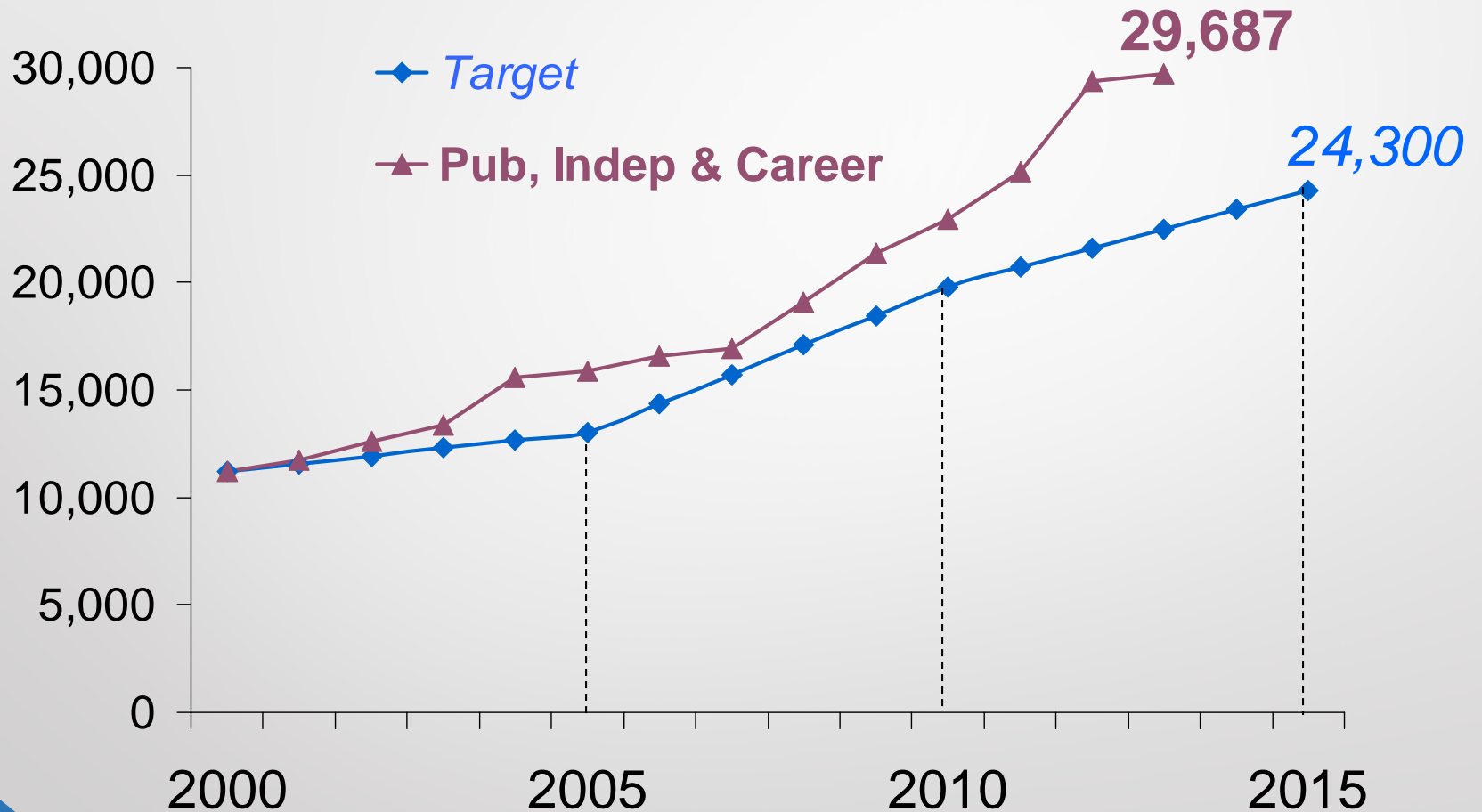


Doctoral degrees awarded continue above the target

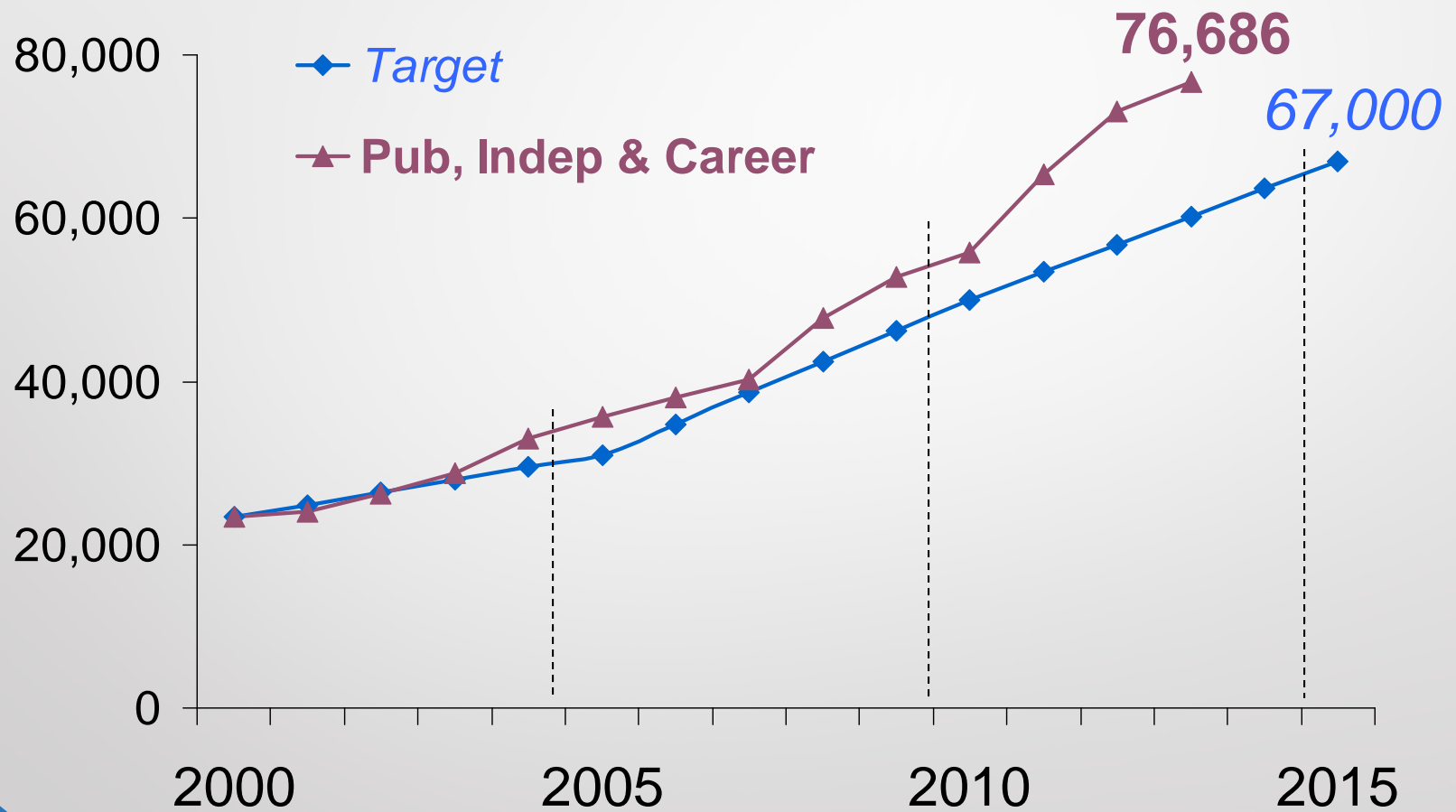

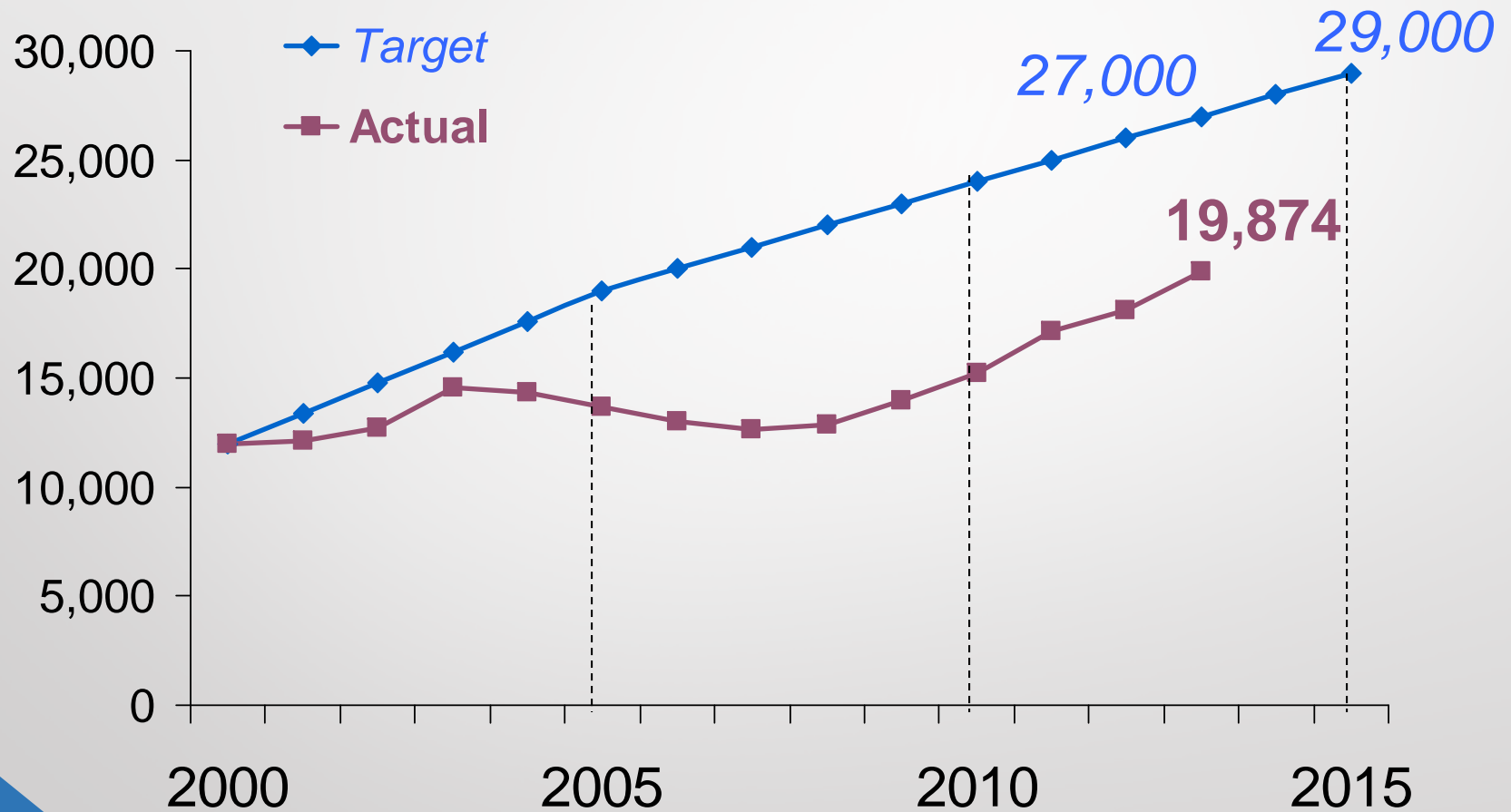
African American undergraduate awards are far above the target, similar to enrollment



Hispanic success is above the target even though enrollments are below

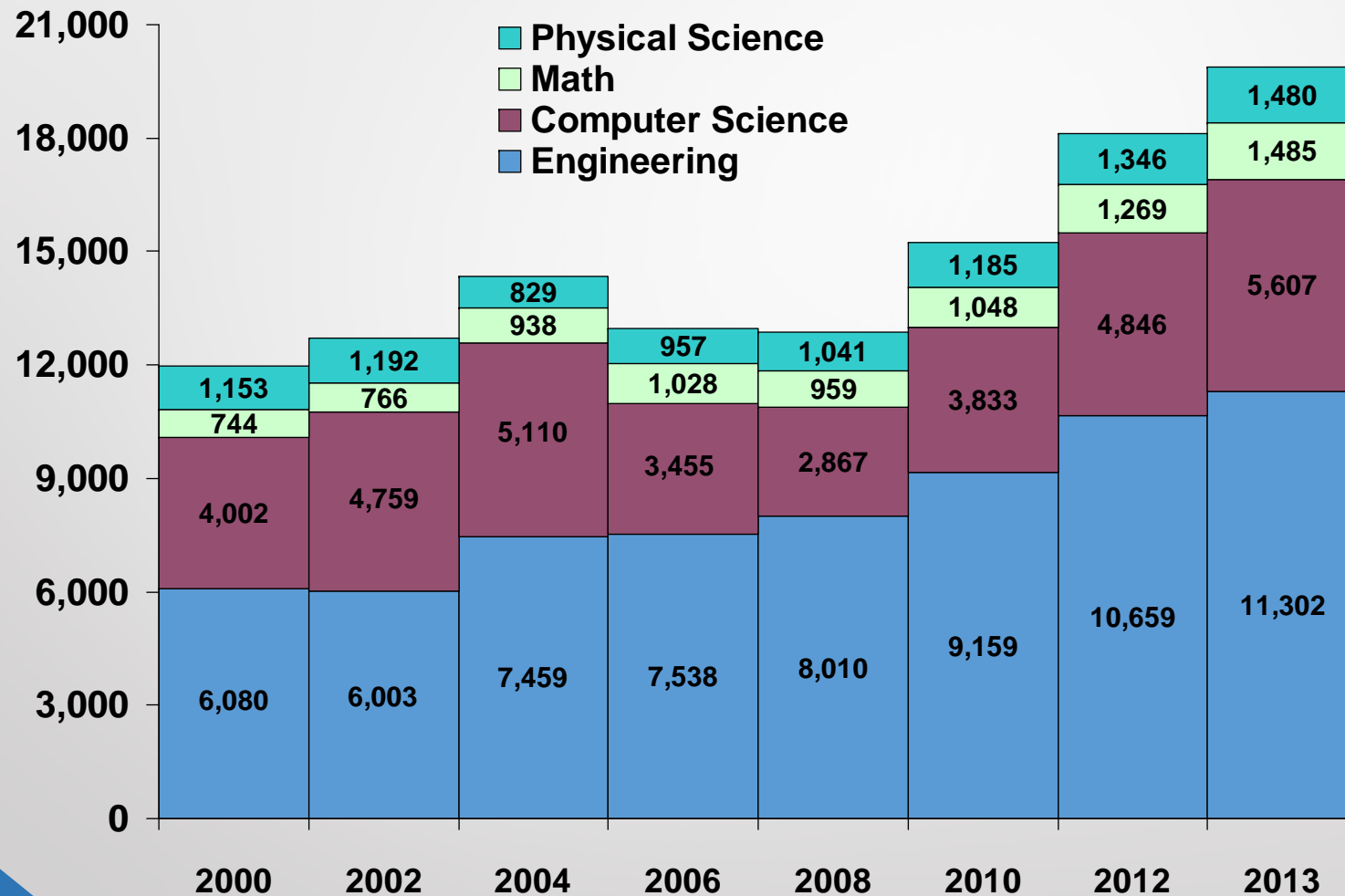


Technology undergraduate awards have not kept pace with the need
