The purpose of the Texas Research Incentive Program (TRIP) is to provide matching funds to assist eligible public institutions in leveraging private gifts for the enhancement of research productivity and faculty recruitment.

* Due to budget reductions, the \$50 million originally appropriated to TRIP has been reduced to **\$47.5 million**. As \$25 million was distributed in FY 2010, only \$22.5 million remains in FY 2011. Institutions submitted donations with eligible matches of \$48,892,390.14. The FY 2011 distribution will cover only slightly more than 97 percent of the eligible match.
