

Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board 2016 Star Award for *60x30TX*

Partnerships among Texas Higher Education Institutions, Public/Private Schools/Districts, Businesses, or Community Organizations

Purpose

The Texas Higher Education Star Award was originally established by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board in 2001 to recognize exceptional contributions toward achieving one or more of the goals of the former long-range Texas higher education plan *Closing the Gaps by 2015*, which brought Texas from 2000 to 2015. The state's new higher education plan, *60x30TX*, adopted by the Coordinating Board in July 2015, builds on the success of *Closing the Gaps* and is designed to establish a globally competitive workforce in Texas by 2030. The new plan establishes four goals – overarching educational attainment, completion, marketable skills, and student debt.

General Eligibility

For partnerships among higher education institutions, public/private schools/districts, businesses, or community organizations to achieve recognition through the Star Award for *60x30TX*, a partnership must be nominated for the award (self-nominations are welcome). Nominees should be those partnerships that are making a contribution to *60x30TX*. Award recipients will be chosen by a designated committee after review of the nominees who complete Star Award for *60x30TX* Applications. The most important criteria in evaluating final applications will be: (1) demonstration of successful outcomes in the areas of overarching educational attainment, completion, marketable skills, or student debt that are attributable to the partnership; (2) demonstration of an efficient cost/benefit ratio per student; and (3) demonstration of improvement and excellence over time through the use of benchmarks and other comparison data that allow progress to be monitored and evaluated.

Eligibility Criteria for the Star Award for *60x30TX*

Nominated partnerships must be helping to meet one or more of the goals of *60x30TX*, including partnerships among Texas:

- public and independent higher education institutions;
- public and private schools or districts;
- businesses; or
- community organizations.

Nomination Submission Requirements

The completed Nomination Cover Sheet and Summary Description must be received at the Coordinating Board offices no later than 5:00 p.m. on June 13, 2016.

1. Complete the Nomination Cover Sheet. This is a form completed by the nominator that includes the nominee's contact information. Please note self-nominations are welcome.
2. Complete the Nomination Summary Description. This is a summary that includes a brief overview of the nominated partnership and explains how the nominee is making an outstanding contribution to *60x30TX* in overarching educational attainment, completion, marketable skills, and/or student debt.
3. Save your form and accompanying description as a PDF file.
