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## Definitions

**Applications:** The counts of applications by Texas resident students, statewide or to institutions other than The University of Texas at Austin (UT-Austin) and Texas A&M University (TAMU), include duplications, unless otherwise noted, because students often apply to more than one institution. Total applications to UT-Austin and TAMU include applicants who apply to both institutions.

**Race/ethnicity:** This report summarizes data by the race/ethnicity of Texas resident students – white, African American, Hispanic, or “other” – based on the racial/ethnic category reported to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) on the THECB Admission Report. Beginning in fall 2010, and in conjunction with a change in federal requirements for reporting race/ethnicity, students who report being multi-racial are included in the “other” category, unless they report one of their races as African American; in that case, the THECB classifies them as African American.

**High schools with low university-going rates:** These Texas high schools are defined in statute as being among the lowest 20 percent of public high schools according to the percentage of their graduates who enroll in a four-year institution, including a general academic teaching institution, in one of the two academic years following the year of an applicant’s high school graduation.

**Regions:** The THECB disaggregates the state into 10 higher education regions. Appendix E provides a map of these regions.

**Small school:** A high school is defined as “small” if it has less than 50 graduates.

**Low socio-economic status (SES):** Students are identified as having low SES if they were reported to the Texas Education Agency as economically disadvantaged. For example, students would be classified this way if they were eligible for free or reduced-price lunches under the National School Lunch Program or if they came from a family with an annual income at or below the official federal poverty line.

**First-time-in-college (FTIC) enrollees:** Students are considered FTIC enrollees if they are reported on the THECB Enrollment Report as FTIC students with a permanent residence in Texas.

**Top 10% enrollees:** First-time-in-college resident students are considered top 10% enrollees if they enrolled at a Texas university and their application filed at that university recorded them as ranked in the top 10 percent of their Texas high school graduating class. If they were not listed as top 10% at the university at which they enrolled, they are not considered a top 10% enrollee, even if they were listed as top 10% at another university where they did not enroll.

## Executive Summary

The Texas top 10% law (75th Texas Legislature, 1997) directs public universities in Texas to admit undergraduate Texas resident applicants who graduate in the top 10 percent of their high school class. The 81st Texas Legislature amended the law in 2009 so that The University of Texas at Austin (UT-Austin) was not required to offer top 10% admissions in excess of 75 percent of its first-time resident undergraduate capacity in a given year. By this time, it was admitting about 80 percent of its resident-entering class under the top 10% law. The amended law requires the THECB to prepare an annual report on the impact of the amendment on admissions. The report examines admissions and enrollment data, broken out by race/ethnicity and region, with additional attention to high school students with low socio-economic status (SES) (those reported to the Texas Education Agency (TEA) as economically disadvantaged), students who graduate from small high schools, and students whose high schools have low college-going rates.

Top 10% first-time-in-college (FTIC) applications submitted by Texas public high school graduates grew steadily between fall 2009 and fall 2015, from approximately 35,000 to almost 52,000. One reason for the statewide increase in top 10% applications is that the average top 10% student has been applying to more institutions. While the number of top 10% applicants increased by about 24 percent between 2009 and 2015, the number of top 10% applications increased by about 47 percent. Together, UT-Austin and Texas A&M University (TAMU) received about 42 percent of the 51,758 statewide top 10% applications for fall 2015, down from about 49 percent for fall 2009. Although the number of top 10% FTIC applications to UT-Austin has been fairly steady at approximately 9,300 to 10,500 annually between 2009 and 2015, its share of statewide top 10% applications has dropped by over 7 percentage points, to about 20 percent. Texas A&M University and the group of all other public universities have received steadily increasing numbers of top 10% applications. The flattening of top 10% application numbers at UT-Austin likely is related to the 75 percent provision of the Texas Legislature's 2009 amendment and the institution's limits on enrollment growth, despite increasing numbers of high school graduates from Texas public high schools.

As the number of top 10% applications has grown, the racial/ethnic composition of students submitting the applications has shifted. For fall 2009, about 34 percent of statewide top 10% FTIC applications were from Hispanic students. That share grew to approximately 42 percent for fall 2015. In the same period, white students' share of top 10% applications fell from about 45 percent to 32 percent, while African Americans' share was relatively stable, between approximately 8 and 9 percent.

Top 10% FTIC enrollment at Texas public universities grew 27 percent between fall 2009 and 2015, faster than the 22.1 percent growth in these institutions in overall resident FTIC enrollment (including top 10% enrollment) during the same period. The share of statewide top 10% FTIC enrollment held by UT-Austin dropped by over 7 percentage points during that time, as TAMU's share increased by 3 points. These two flagships enrolled approximately 52 percent of the top 10% FTIC students in fall 2015, down from about 56 percent in fall 2009.

White top 10% FTIC enrollment totaled 8,281 in fall 2015, about 40 percent of the statewide total for all racial/ethnic groups. Although the 2015 enrollment figure was virtually the same as fall 2009's total (8,294), the white share of statewide top 10% enrollment had fallen by

about 11 percentage points. Approximately 61 percent of white top 10% FTIC enrollment was at UT-Austin and TAMU in fall 2015. That combined percentage has dropped by only about 2 points since 2009, but TAMU's share has increased by nearly 5 points while UT-Austin's share has dropped by over 7 points.

African Americans' share of top 10% FTIC enrollment has been very constant, about 7 percent, from fall 2009 to 2015. The University of Texas at Austin enrolled 22 percent of African American top 10% FTIC students in fall 2015, sharply up from its 15.3 percent share the previous fall but still below its nearly 25 percent share in fall 2009. The percentage of statewide African American top 10% FTIC students at TAMU has grown from about 14 percent in fall 2009 to just over 21 percent in 2015.

Hispanic top 10% FTIC enrollment increased by about 60 percent from fall 2009 to fall 2015, when it reached 7,565. That was approximately 37 percent of statewide top 10% enrollment, a 7.6-point increase since fall 2009. The share of Hispanic top 10% FTIC students enrolled at TAMU grew nearly 5 percentage points between fall 2009 and 2015, while UT-Austin's share dropped almost 9 points. Other public universities' share of Hispanic top 10% FTIC students trended upward by about 4 percentage points over those six years, to 58.6 percent. The declining share of top 10% enrollment at UT-Austin for white, African American, and Hispanic students may be due to the limitations on enrollment at that institution, noted earlier in this section.

The distribution of FTIC enrollment at Texas public universities by Texas region of residence – total and top 10% – generally has been very similar to the distribution of public high school graduates by region of residence. For example, for Fiscal Year (FY) 2015, approximately 27 percent of public high school graduates resided in the Metroplex, about 24 percent of resident FTIC enrollment in public universities came from the Metroplex, and about 25 percent of top 10% FTIC enrollment came from the Metroplex. Each of the two flagships drew about 56 percent of top 10% enrollment from the Gulf Coast and Metroplex, combined, in fall 2015, two regions that, combined, provided nearly 52 percent of public high school graduates in FY 2015.

Enrollment of top 10% students with low SES increased from 3,926 in fall 2009 to 6,103 in fall 2015, which increased the low SES share of all top 10% enrollment from 25.7 percent to 31.2 percent. Over the same period, TAMU's share of statewide top 10% students with low SES increased by approximately 3 percentage points to 20.1 percent, while UT-Austin's share fell by approximately 7 percentage points to 18 percent.

Only 716 top 10% FTIC enrollees came from small public high schools (those with less than 50 graduates) in fall 2015, 3.7 percent of all top 10% FTIC enrollees that fall. Students from these high schools typically enroll at public universities other than the flagships; nearly 63 percent of them enrolled somewhere besides UT-Austin and TAMU in fall 2015. A somewhat higher number of fall 2015 top 10% FTIC enrollees – 1,002, or 5.1 percent of total top 10% FTIC enrollment – came from high schools with low university-going rates (the lowest 20 percent of rates). Texas A&M University and UT-Austin together enrolled about 36 percent of these students in fall 2015, down from approximately 40 percent in fall 2009. The distribution of these students at the two flagships changed a lot in those six years. In fall 2009, each flagship had about 20 percent of the top 10% FTIC students from high schools with low university-going rates. By 2015, TAMU's share grew to 22 percent while UT-Austin's share fell to 14.5 percent.

## Introduction

The automatic admission statute (codified as Texas Education Code, Section 51.803, 75th Texas Legislature, 1997), known as the “top 10%” law, requires that Texas resident students who graduate in the top 10 percent of their class at public and private high schools be given automatic admission to Texas public, general academic, teaching institutions in one of the first two academic years after their graduation. This statute applies only to admission at four-year public higher education institutions.

Over time, the top 10% law has had the greatest impact on the most selective four-year public higher education institutions, especially The University of Texas at Austin (UT-Austin), which admitted approximately 80 percent of its fall 2009 first-time-in-college (FTIC) Texas resident students under the top 10% law. In contrast, six less selective public universities admitted fewer than 9 percent of their FTIC students in fall 2009 under the top 10% law.

The 81st Texas Legislature amended the top 10% law in 2009 to say, “Beginning with admissions for the 2011-2012 academic year, The University of Texas at Austin is not required to offer admission to applicants who qualify for automatic admission under Subsection (a) in excess of the number required to fill 75 percent of the university’s enrollment capacity designated for first-time resident undergraduate students in an academic year.”

The amended top 10% law requires UT-Austin to admit “in good faith” its estimate of the number of top 10% students who will comprise 75 percent of its resident undergraduate entering class. The institution is to admit these students by rank order, starting with the highest, until the school has admitted its estimate of 75 percent of its entering class. Top 10% students not admitted as part of the initial selection become part of the general admission pool with all other applicants. In 2013, with HB 1843, the 83rd Texas Legislature extended this allowance through the 2017-18 academic year, and in 2015, the 84th Texas Legislature (HB 2472) made the 75 percent allowance for UT-Austin permanent.

The top 10% law also requires that the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) annually report on how this admission change for UT-Austin affects the state’s progress toward its higher education plan, *Closing the Gaps by 2015*, which was in effect through 2015 and succeeded by a new 15-year plan, *60x30TX*. The top 10% report must cover admissions by:

- Race/ethnicity
- Socioeconomic status (SES)
- Region
- Small high schools
- High schools in the bottom 20 percent in numbers of graduates sent to four-year institutions in one of the first two years after graduation

This report includes data from fall 2009 through fall 2015 and compares results for top 10% students alone and all FTIC students (including top 10%). The report breaks out results into four groups of public universities: all, UT-Austin, Texas A&M University (TAMU), and all excluding UT-Austin and TAMU. This report excludes data from public two-year, independent,



and out-of-state higher education institutions, and for students who did not enroll in higher education by fall 2015.

## Applications

### Applications - Overview

From fall 2009 to fall 2015, applications to Texas public universities by top 10% FTIC degree-seeking applicants (recent graduates of Texas public and private high schools) grew by 47.4 percent, from 35,103 to 51,758 (Table 1). In the same period, FTIC applications to these institutions by all Texas high school graduates (top 10% and non-top 10%) grew slightly faster, by 48.3 percent (from 182,307 to 270,451) (Appendix A).

In the two most recent years of data, between fall 2014 and fall 2015, top 10% applications grew by 4.4 percent (49,596 to 51,758), compared with a 5.5 percent increase in all applications (256,411 to 270,451) (Table 2). Together, UT-Austin and TAMU accounted for 20.2 percent, or about one-fifth of the total university applications (including top 10%) for fall 2015, and separately, each of these institutions received about one-fifth of the top 10% applications.

African American and Hispanic applicants submitted a smaller percentage of their applications (total and top 10%) to UT-Austin and TAMU than white students. For example, in fall 2015, 12.5 percent of whites' total applications were for UT-Austin, compared with 4.5 percent for African Americans and 7.3 percent for Hispanics. There was a similar pattern at TAMU, where the percentages were 17.2 percent, white; 3.8 percent, African American; and 7.5 percent, Hispanic.

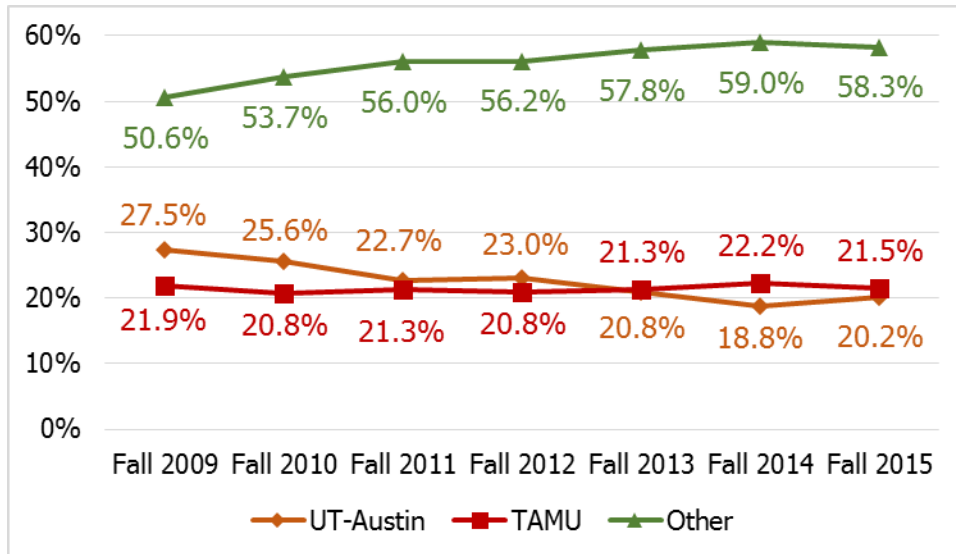
Table 3 displays the change in the number of FTIC applicants over the last five years, the total and the top 10% component, as well as the total and per-applicant numbers of top 10% applications. The average top 10% student has been steadily applying to more public universities, as demonstrated by two trends. First, top 10% applications grew by 47.4 percent between fall 2009 and 2015 (as mentioned in the discussion of Table 1 data), while top 10% applicants only increased by 24.3 percent, from 24,123 to 29,990. Second, the average top 10% applicant applied to 1.73 universities for fall 2015, up from 1.46 for fall 2009.

The University of Texas at Austin garnered 10,451, or 20.2 percent of 51,758 statewide top 10% applications from Texas residents for fall 2015 (Appendix Table A.7 and Figure 1). That share was up from 18.8 percent for fall 2014, but UT-Austin’s share has been trending downward since fall 2009, when it was 27.5 percent. The 7.3-point drop in share of top 10% applications since 2009 was much greater than UT-Austin’s 2.3-point drop in share of all FTIC applications during that time. These developments are likely due to the 75 percent allowance in the top 10% law, mentioned earlier in this report, and to a flattening of enrollment levels at UT-Austin. Its enrollment totaled 50,995 in fall 2009 and grew to 52,186 in fall 2012 before falling to 50,950 in fall 2015, 45 less than six years earlier. The 21.5 percent share of top 10% applications that went to TAMU for fall 2015 was just 0.4 percentage point less than in fall 2009, as TAMU’s total fall enrollment grew by nearly 10,000 in that period.

Texas public universities other than UT-Austin and TAMU saw a steady increase in their share of top 10% applications between 2009 and 2014, from 50.6 percent to 59.0 percent, before a small drop to a 58.3 percent share for fall 2015. For all FTIC Texas resident applications (including top 10%) to public universities other than the two flagships, the

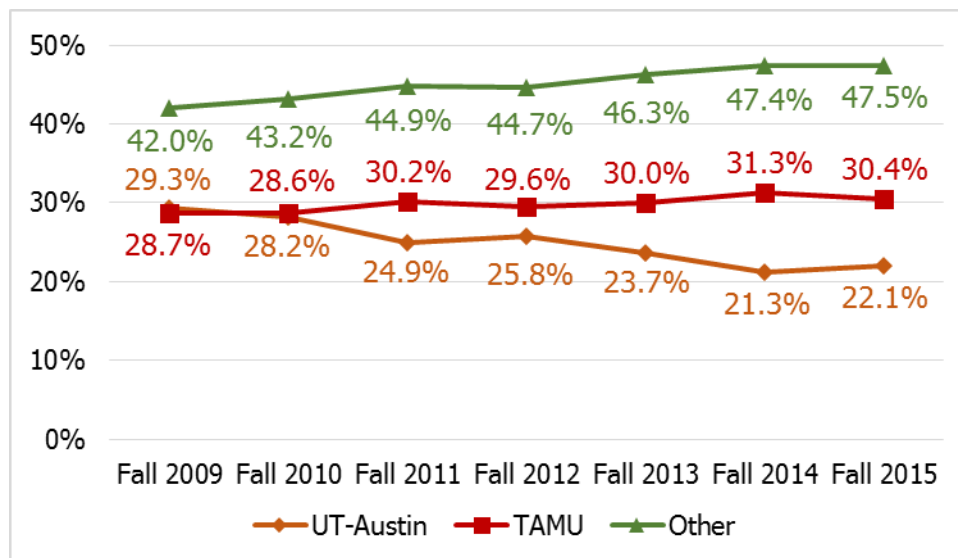
percentage of statewide applications rose nearly 3 points from fall 2009 (77.0 percent) to fall 2015 (79.8 percent or 215,849/270,451) (Appendix A).

### Applications – White

White students’ share of statewide FTIC applications to public universities dropped by over 11 percentage points between fall 2009 and 2015 (from 76,450 of 182,307, or 41.9 percent, to 82,614 of 270,451, or 30.5 percent) (Appendix A). The share dropped despite an increase of over 6,000 applications by whites, because applications from the other racial/ethnic groups increased by far more, nearly 82,000, from 105,857 to 187,837. Applications from white top 10% FTIC students totaled 15,958 in 2009 and reached 16,816 in 2015. The white share of all top 10% applications fell steadily between fall 2009 and fall 2015, from 45.5 percent to 32.5 percent, a 13-point drop.

First-time-in-college applications to UT-Austin by whites rebounded in fall 2015, to 10,292, after dropping to 9,451 the previous year. White FTIC applications to TAMU decreased slightly for fall 2010, but have steadily increased thereafter, reaching 14,234 for fall 2015. Applications by white students to other public universities (besides UT-Austin and TAMU) followed a pattern of change similar to that at TAMU, dropping between fall 2009 and 2010 to 52,116 but reaching 58,088 for fall 2015. In general, top 10% FTIC applications by institution from whites (Figure 2) have followed trends that are similar to trends for all racial/ethnic groups combined (Figure 1), with UT-Austin losing its share of applications, TAMU holding steady with its share or increasing it a little, and other institutions gaining substantially more share. For fall 2009, 29.3 percent of top 10% applications from white students went to UT-Austin, 28.7 percent to TAMU, and 42.0 percent to other public universities. By 2015, the percentages had changed to 22.1, 30.4, and 47.5 percent, respectively, due to UT-Austin’s share trending more than 7 points lower, a 1.7-point increase in share at TAMU, and a 5.5-point increase at other public universities.

**Figure 2.** Institutional Shares of Statewide Top 10% Applications, White

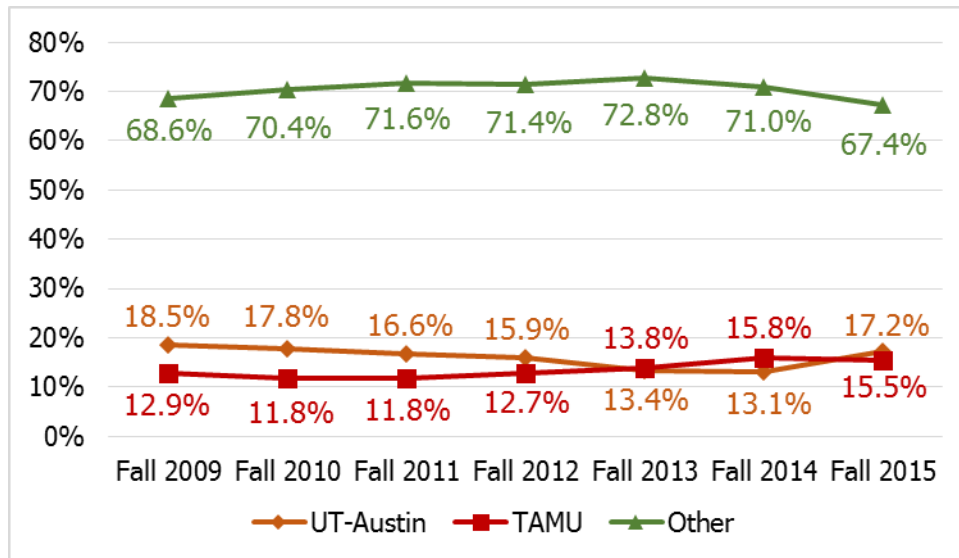


## Applications – African American

Total FTIC applications to public universities from African American Texas residents increased every fall between 2009 and 2015, except for a drop of 1,520 students in 2013, rising from 29,547 to 41,955. African Americans’ share of all FTIC applications during those years ranged from 15.4 percent for fall 2013 to 16.8 percent for fall 2012. In fall 2015, their share was 15.5 percent (41,955/270,451). African American top 10% applications represented a smaller share of statewide top 10% applications, varying from 7.9 percent (for fall 2015) to 8.6 percent (for fall 2012) over the seven years.

African Americans increased their share of statewide top 10% applications to UT-Austin from 13.1 percent to 17.2 percent between fall 2014 and fall 2015 (Figure 3). That reversed five years of declining share, from 18.5 percent in fall 2009 to 13.1 percent in fall 2014. African Americans’ share of top 10% applications to TAMU declined for fall 2015 to 15.5 percent. That came after three years of increases, from 11.8 percent to 15.8 percent for fall 2014. At other public universities, excluding the two flagships, the African American share of top 10% applications dropped nearly 4 percentage points, to 67.4 percent, from fall 2014 to 2015. That was over 5 percentage points below the peak share of 72.8 percent in fall 2013.

**Figure 3.** Institutional Shares of Statewide Top 10% Applications, African American

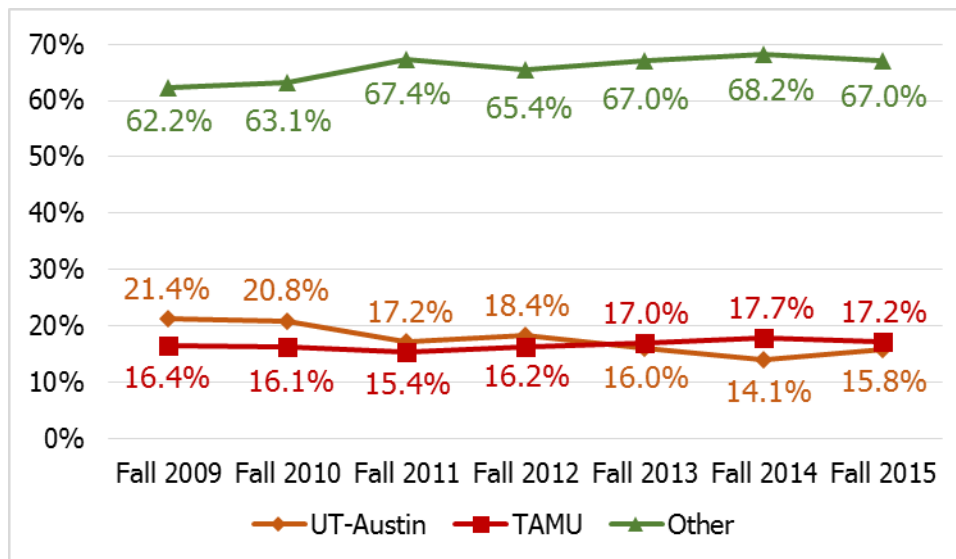


## Applications – Hispanic

Hispanic Texas resident students have been rapidly increasing both total and top 10% FTIC applications to Texas public universities. They submitted a total of 59,053 for fall 2009 (11,824 of those were top 10%). For fall 2015, the numbers grew to 109,989 total and 21,551 top 10%, increases of 86.3 percent and 82.3 percent, respectively. Hispanics increased their share of statewide FTIC university applications by 8.3 percentage points, from 32.4 percent to 40.7 percent, between fall 2009 and fall 2015. They increased their share of top 10% applications by nearly the same number of percentage points, from 33.7 percent to 41.6 percent.

Hispanic FTIC applications to TAMU increased from 4,305 to 8,291 between fall 2009 and 2015 (a 92.6 percent increase), and top 10% applications increased 90.5 percent; TAMU's share of statewide top 10% Hispanic applications grew from 16.4 percent in 2009 to 17.2 percent in 2015 (Figure 4). The University of Texas at Austin received 3,414 applications from Hispanic top 10% students for fall 2015, nearly 600 more than for the previous year, increasing the institution's share of statewide top 10% applications from 14.1 percent to 15.8 percent. That reversed two years of declining share for UT-Austin, but its share remained below TAMU's share for the third straight year; UT-Austin's share in fall 2015 was 5.6 points below its share in fall 2009.

**Figure 4.** Institutional Shares of Statewide Top 10% Applications, Hispanic



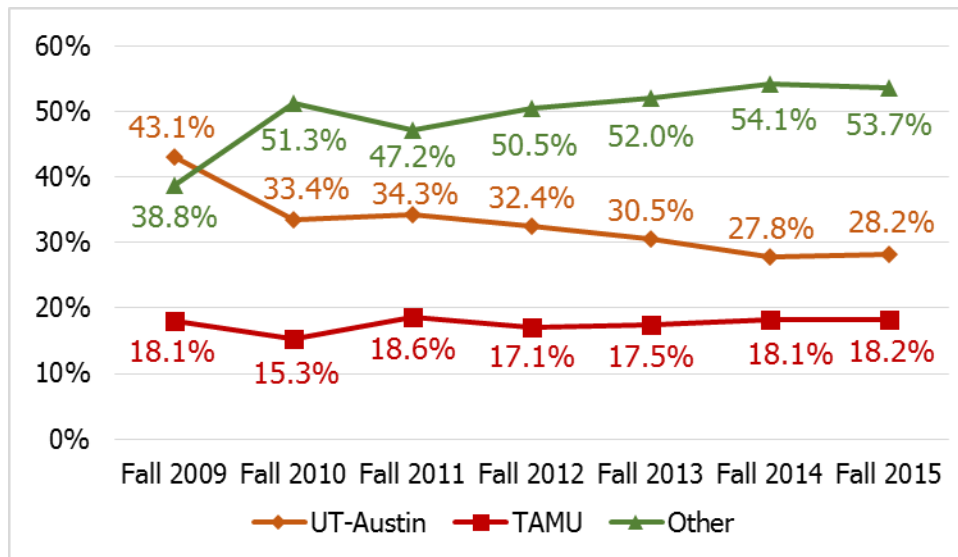
### Applications – “Other” Racial/Ethnic Groups

Applications from Texas FTIC students with an “other” race/ethnicity (excluding white, African American, and Hispanic) to public universities more than doubled between fall 2009 and fall 2015, from 17,257 to 35,893. The largest year-to-year increase occurred in fall 2010, when there were 25,018 applications by “other” students, 7,761, or 45.0 percent more than the previous year. One reason for this increase could be that the THECB revised definitions for racial/ethnic categories in fall 2010 to match more closely new federal requirements. The revised definitions included classifying multiracial students as either African American or “other.” The “other” group’s share of statewide applications grew from 9.5 percent to 13.3 percent between 2009 and 2015. Applications from the top 10% segment of the “other” group more than doubled between 2009 and 2015, from 4,413 to 9,294, reaching 18.0 percent of 51,758 top 10% applications in fall 2015, well up from a 12.6 percent share in fall 2009.

The most dramatic change in top 10% applications by “other” FTIC students occurred between 2009 and 2010, when the share of top 10% applications to institutions other than the two flagships jumped from 38.8 percent to 51.3 percent, and the share for UT-Austin plunged nearly 10 percentage points, from 43.1 percent to 33.4 percent (Figure 5). Texas A&M University lost nearly 3 percentage points of share from 2009 to 2010. The share of top 10% applications to UT-Austin improved a little for fall 2011 (to 34.3 percent), but it dropped to

27.8 percent by fall 2014 before increasing somewhat to 28.2 percent the next year. Top 10% applications to TAMU by students in the “other” category reached 18.2 percent for fall 2015, 0.1 percentage point above the fall 2009 and 2014 shares.

**Figure 5.** Institutional Shares of Statewide Top 10% Applications, “Other” Race/Ethnicity



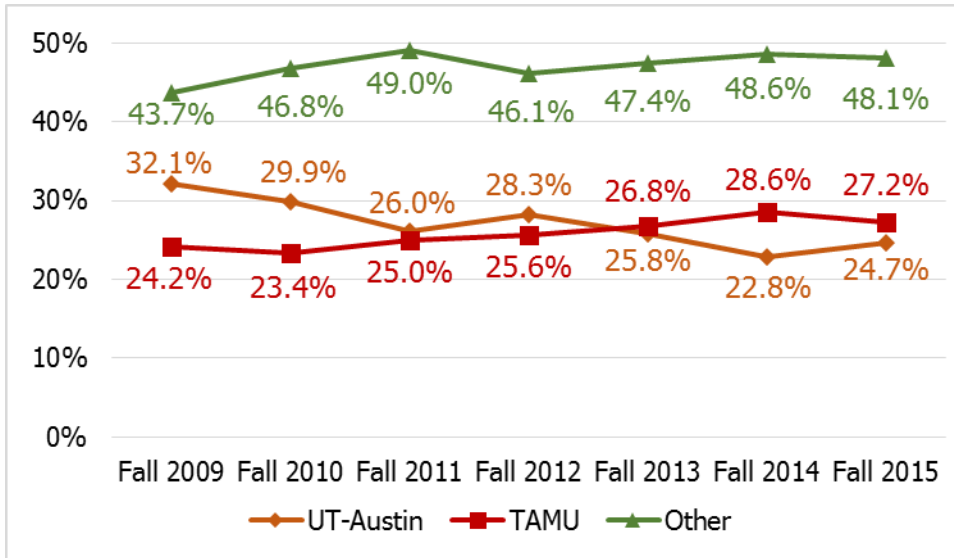
## Enrollment

### Enrollment – Overview

Enrollment of top 10% FTIC students in Texas public universities has grown steadily since fall 2009, somewhat faster than for all FTIC (including top 10%) students. From fall 2009 to fall 2015, top 10% FTIC enrollment grew 27.0 percent (from 16,186 to 20,561), versus 22.1 percent for all FTIC public university students (from 62,674 to 76,513) (Appendix A). Annual FTIC enrollment growth slowed to just 0.1 percent in fall 2015 (from 76,449 to 76,513), while the top 10% component grew by 1.2 percent (from 20,308 to 20,561).

The University of Texas at Austin increased its share of statewide top 10% FTIC enrollment from 22.8 percent in fall 2014 to 24.7 percent in fall 2015, following two years of declining share and a loss of over 9 percentage points of share since fall 2009 (Figure 6). Top 10% FTIC enrollment at UT-Austin increased by over 400 in fall 2015, to 5,076, following two years of declines. Texas A&M University’s top 10% FTIC enrollment dropped in fall 2015 (to 5,597 from 5,806 the previous year), the first decline since at least fall 2009. Its share of the statewide level fell from 28.6 percent to 27.2 percent, but that still exceeded UT-Austin’s share and it was 3.0 percentage points higher than in 2009.

Public universities other than UT-Austin and TAMU have seen a rise from 43.7 percent of all top 10% FTIC enrollment in fall 2009 to as much as 49.0 percent (in fall 2011), finally settling at 48.1 percent in fall 2015. These institutions' share of total FTIC enrollment (including top 10%) has changed less, rising from 77.3 percent in fall 2009 to 79.1 percent in 2015. The pattern in enrollment change for top 10% students, in part, may be related to the 75 percent rule at UT-Austin, but also may be related to other factors, such as economic or demographic changes or a shift in perception about institutions' reputations and the educational value they offer.

At UT-Austin, 75.3 percent (5,076 of 6,745) of Texas resident FTIC enrollees in fall 2015 were top 10%, up from 71.5 percent (4,628 of 6,475) in fall 2014 (Table 4). Hispanic top 10% FTIC enrollment at UT-Austin (1,419) was 85.5 percent of all Hispanic FTIC students in fall 2015, exceeding the white (68.7 percent) and African American (78.5 percent) percentages. Of TAMU's 9,269 FTIC students in fall 2015, 5,597, or 60.4 percent were top 10%. African American students had the highest share of top 10% enrollees of total FTIC enrollment among the major racial/ethnic groups (291 of 395, or 73.7 percent) at TAMU.

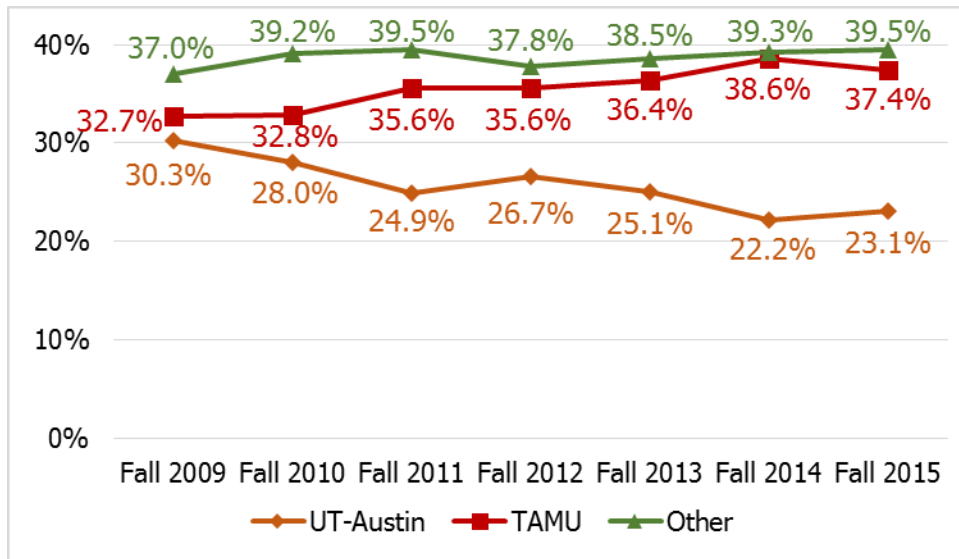

### Enrollment – White

White FTIC enrollment in Texas public universities fell from 29,370 to 28,550 between fall 2014 and 2015 (Appendix A). The top 10% component also fell, from 8,326 to 8,281. As with white applications, the white share of FTIC enrollment and its top 10% component have been declining. In fall 2009, whites accounted for 47.0 percent of total FTIC resident enrollment (29,428 of 62,674). That percentage fell every year thereafter, reaching 37.3 percent (28,550 of 76,513) in fall 2015. White top 10% FTIC enrollment of 8,294 in fall 2009 made up 51.2 percent of statewide top 10% enrollment, but that share has dropped steadily since then, reaching 40.3 percent (8,281/20,561) in fall 2015.

In fall 2009, 2,512, or 30.3 percent of the 8,294 white top 10% FTIC students enrolled in Texas public universities were at UT-Austin (Figure 7). This share has trended downward since then, reaching 22.2 percent in 2014 and recovering somewhat to 23.1 percent in 2015. The opposite occurred at TAMU. Its share of white top 10% enrollees rose from 32.7 percent to 38.6 percent between 2009 and 2014 but dropped to 37.4 percent in 2015. Since UT-Austin and TAMU tended to balance each other out, the share of white top 10% enrollment at other public universities was relatively flat, ranging from 37.0 to 39.5 percent between fall 2009 and 2015.

**Figure 7.** Institutional Shares of Statewide Top 10% FTIC Enrollment, White

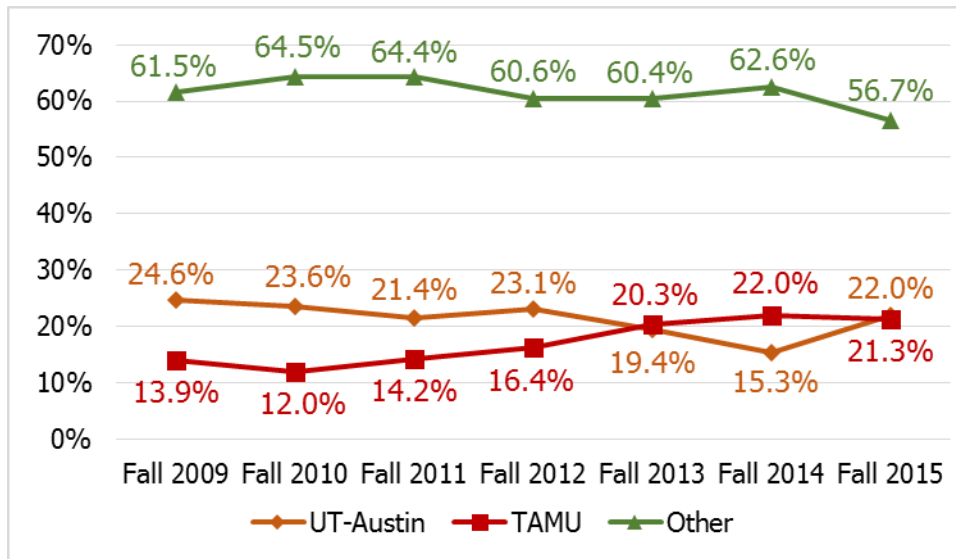


### Enrollment – African American

African American FTIC resident enrollment at public universities decreased in fall 2015 to 9,798, after increasing to 10,041 the previous year. Its share of all FTIC enrollment fell from 13.1 percent to 12.8 percent. The share was 14.0 percent in fall 2009 and 2010. African Americans’ share of statewide top 10% enrollment also decreased in fall 2015 from 6.8 percent the previous year to 6.6 percent. The share was between 7.0 and 7.1 percent between fall 2009 and fall 2012.

The share of African American top 10% FTIC students enrolled at UT-Austin jumped dramatically, from 15.3 percent to 22.0 percent, between fall 2014 and fall 2015. The share enrolled at TAMU, which had trended upward from 13.9 percent for fall 2009 to 22.0 percent for fall 2014, fell 0.7 percentage point for fall 2015 to 21.3 percent, below UT-Austin’s share for the first time since fall 2012. In response to the increase in share at UT-Austin, other public universities’ share of African American top 10% enrollment sank almost 6 percentage points, to 56.7 percent.

**Figure 8.** Institutional Shares of Statewide Top 10% FTIC Enrollment, African American

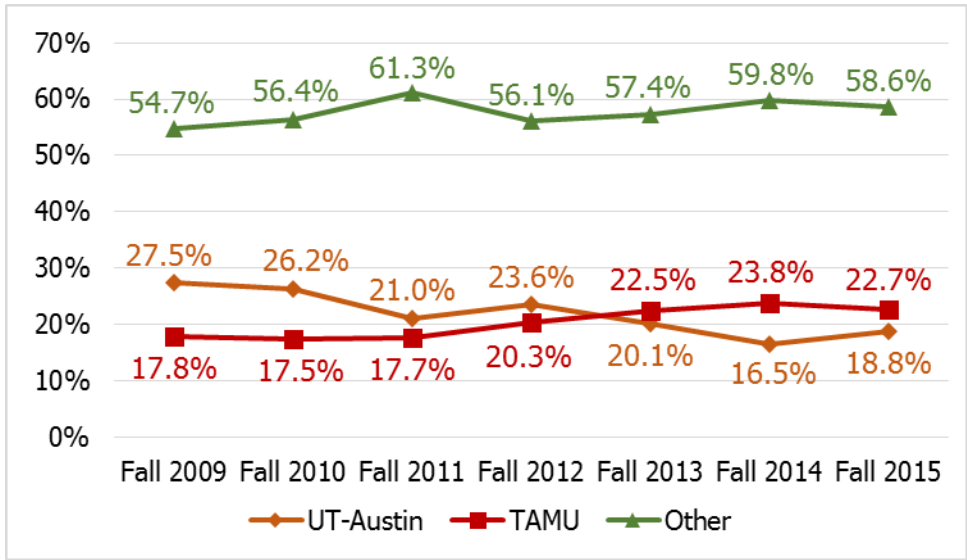


### Enrollment – Hispanic

As with growth in applications from Hispanics, Hispanic resident FTIC and top 10% enrollment have been growing very fast at public universities. First-time-in-college enrollment increased 10,294, or 54.7 percent from 18,817 in fall 2009 to 29,111 in fall 2015. The top 10% component of FTIC enrollment grew even faster (59.9 percent), from 4,730 to 7,565. Hispanic enrollment as a percentage of all FTIC enrollment went from 30.0 percent in 2009 to 38.0 percent in 2015. Similarly, Hispanic top 10% enrollment as a percentage of all top 10% enrollment increased from 29.2 percent in fall 2009 to 36.8 percent in fall 2015.

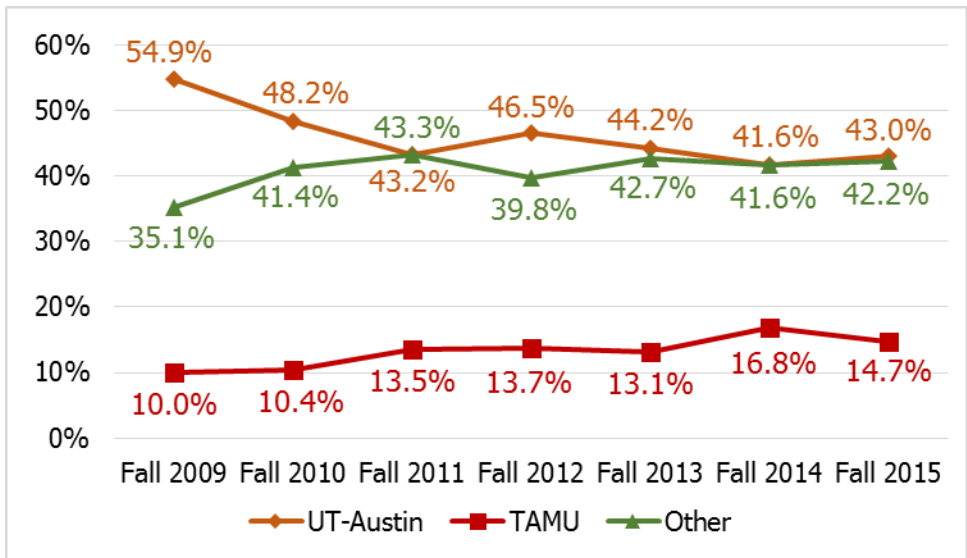
**Figure 9.** Institutional Shares of Statewide Top 10% FTIC Enrollment, Hispanic

Texas A&M University increased its Hispanic resident FTIC enrollment (total and top 10%) every fall between 2009 and 2014, but in fall 2015 those numbers dropped slightly. That year, TAMU enrolled 2,416 FTIC Hispanics, of whom 1,714 were top 10% (22.7 percent of the statewide top 10% figure) (Figure 9). The share for TAMU had risen from 17.5 percent to 23.8 percent in the previous five years. The share for UT-Austin of top 10% FTIC Hispanic enrollment dropped from 27.5 percent to 16.5 percent from fall 2009 to 2014, but rebounded in fall 2015 to 18.8 percent. Public institutions other than TAMU and UT-Austin reached their greatest share of Hispanic top 10% enrollment in fall 2011, at 61.3 percent, but that dropped over 5 percentage points the following year and stood at 58.6 percent in fall 2015.

**Enrollment – “Other” Racial/Ethnic Groups**

“Other” Texas resident FTIC enrollment grew steadily from 5,664 in fall 2009 to 9,054 in fall 2015, a 59.9 percent increase. The top 10% segment of “other” FTIC enrollment grew even faster, from 2,029 to 3,351, a 65.2 percent increase. The share of statewide top 10% FTIC enrollment of “other” students at TAMU increased from 10.0 percent in fall 2009 to 16.8 percent in fall 2014, but dropped the following fall to 14.7 percent (Figure 10). During the same period, UT-Austin’s share of top 10% enrollment for this group of students plunged by over 13 percentage points, to 41.6 percent, before recovering somewhat to 43.0 percent. Public universities other than the two flagships enrolled 42.2 percent of “other” top 10% FTIC students in fall 2015, up 7.1 points from fall 2009.

## High School Graduates and Enrollment – Regional

More than one-quarter of the 313,397 Texas public high school graduates in Fiscal Year (FY) 2015 were from schools in the Metroplex (Table 5). (The figure of 313,397 includes a small number of duplications. For example, a student could have graduated from two different high schools, possibly in different regions. There were 313,369 unduplicated graduates in FY 2015 and 303,092 in FY 2014.) About 45 percent of the FY 2015 graduates were from the Gulf Coast and South Texas. The distribution of high school graduates by region changed little between FY 2014 and 2015.

The majority of resident FTIC enrollees – total and top 10% – came from the Gulf Coast, Metroplex, and South Texas in roughly the same proportions as graduated from high school in FY 2014 and 2015 (Appendix C). The Northwest and West Texas accounted for the lowest percentages of resident FTIC students – total and top 10%.

At UT-Austin, more than half of top 10% FTIC enrollees in fall 2015 came from the Gulf Coast (1,472 of 5,076, or 29.0 percent) and the Metroplex (1,367, or 26.9 percent) combined. A similar pattern occurred at TAMU, with 32.3 percent of 5,597 top 10% FTIC enrollees from the Gulf Coast and 23.2 percent from the Metroplex. The smallest share of top 10% FTIC enrollment at UT-Austin came from West Texas, with 0.7 percent in fall 2015; the High Plains and the Northwest had the next smallest shares (0.9 percent each). The Upper Rio Grande accounted for 0.9 percent of TAMU's top 10% enrollees, and West Texas contributed 1.2 percent.

## Enrollment – Other Student Characteristics

The top 10% statute mandates examination of the top 10% data with respect to several additional student characteristics: low SES; whether the public high school the student graduated from was "small"; and whether the high school had low university-going rates. The

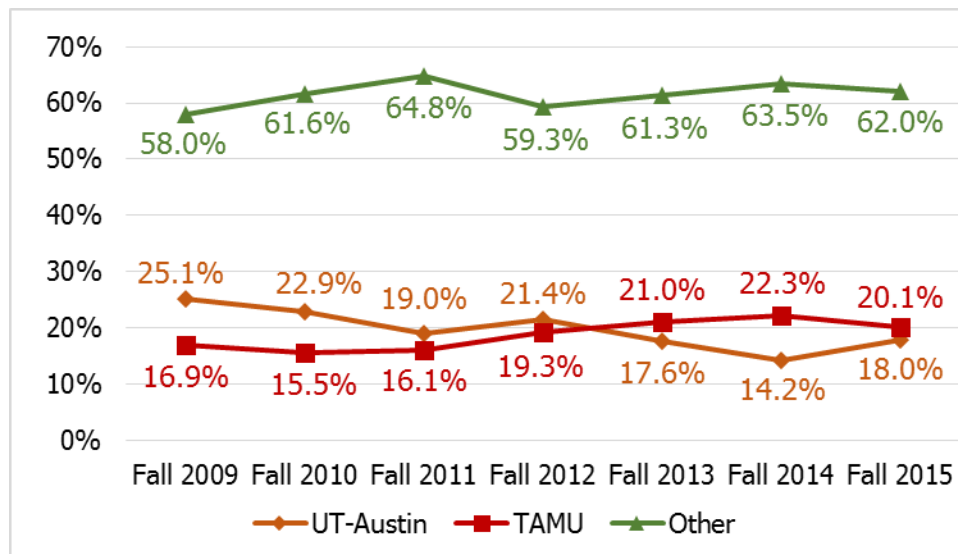
THECB was unable to classify about 1,000 FTIC top 10% students enrolled each fall from 2009 through 2015 (approximately 6 percent of each cohort) by these characteristics, because these students could not be found in the two years of TEA public high school graduation data that preceded each fall. Consequently, student counts in the following sections will be somewhat smaller than in previous sections for some measures. Appendices B and D refer to the adjusted counts as being “without unknowns.”

### Enrollment – Low SES

Statewide public university enrollment of top 10% students with low SES increased from 3,926 in fall 2009 (25.7 percent of top 10% FTIC enrollment, excluding unknowns, of 15,279) to 4,662 in fall 2010 (28.9 percent of top 10% enrollment) (Appendix B). Low SES top 10% enrollment increased to 6,103 by fall 2015; that was 31.2 percent of top 10% FTIC enrollment (without unknowns) of 19,591 in fall 2015.

In fall 2009, 662 of TAMU’s top 10% FTIC students had low SES, a 16.9 percent share of the statewide total of 3,926 students with low SES (Figure 11). The institution’s share dropped the following year, to 15.5 percent, but then increased for four years, reaching 22.3 percent in fall 2014. That exceeded UT-Austin’s share (14.2 percent) for the second year in a row. In fall 2015, the share at TAMU fell to 20.1 percent of the statewide total of 6,103 students with low SES (excluding unknowns). The University of Texas at Austin’s share began at 25.1 percent in fall 2009 but trended downward thereafter through fall 2014, to 14.2 percent, before bumping up to 18.0 percent in fall 2015. Other institutions had a 58.0 percent share of statewide top 10% FITC enrollment in fall 2009. Their share rose as high as 64.8 percent (in fall 2011) before settling at 62.0 percent in fall 2015.

**Figure 11.** Institutional Shares of Statewide Top 10% FTIC Enrollment, Low SES



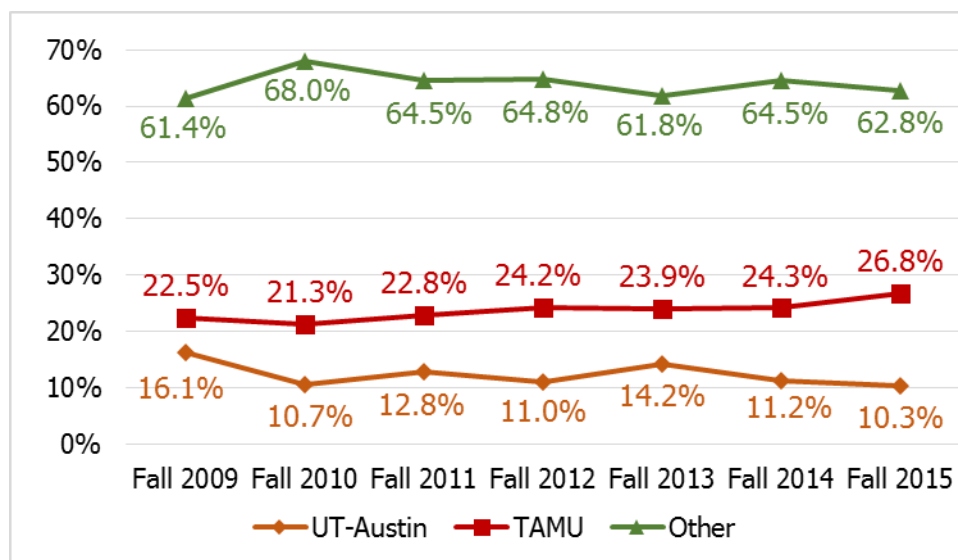
### Enrollment – from Small Public High Schools

In fall 2009, 694 top 10% FTIC students from small Texas public high schools (those with less than 50 graduates) enrolled at a Texas public university (Appendix B). That was just

4.5 percent of the total top 10% enrollment (excluding unknowns) of 15,279 that year. There were 716, or 22 more top 10% enrollees from small high schools in fall 2015, but their share of total top 10% FTIC enrollment (excluding unknowns) of 19,591 students fell to 3.7 percent.

Nearly two-thirds of top 10% FTIC students coming from small high schools typically enroll at institutions other than UT-Austin and TAMU, with TAMU enrolling about 21 to 27 percent of these students between fall 2009 and 2015 (Figure 12). Its share was 26.8 percent in fall 2015, the highest in the seven-year period. The share enrolling at UT Austin has trended downward from 16.1 percent in fall 2009 to 10.3 percent in 2015.

**Figure 12.** Institutional Shares of Statewide Top 10% FTIC Enrollment, Small High Schools

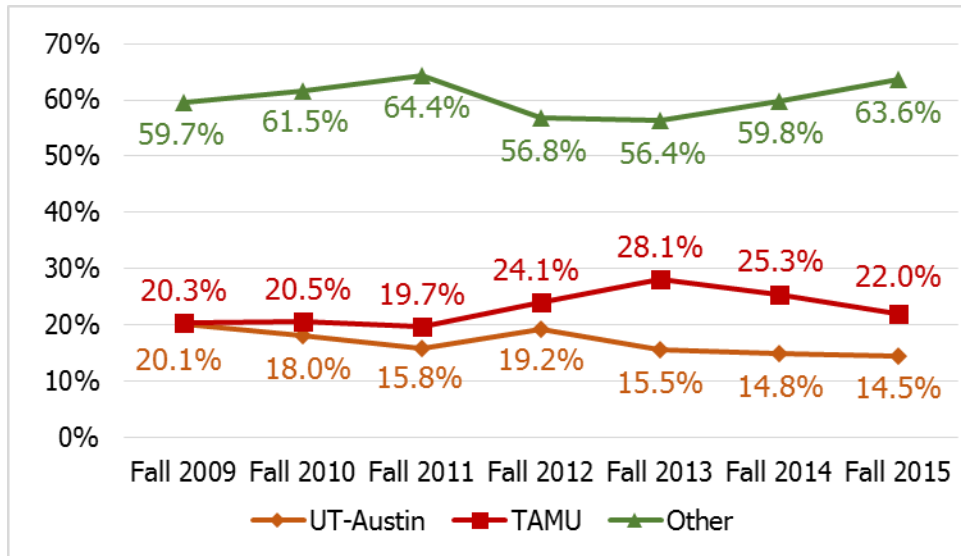


### Enrollment – from Public High Schools with Low University-Going Rates

A total of 932 top 10% FTIC students from Texas public high schools with the lowest 20 percent of university-going rates enrolled in a public university in fall 2009 (Appendix B). That was 6.1 percent of total top 10% FTIC enrollment that year, excluding unknowns, of 15,279. The percentage dropped to 5.1 percent by fall 2015, when just 1,002 top 10% students from this group enrolled in a public university.

Texas A&M University increased its share of this group of students from 20.3 percent to 28.1 percent between fall 2009 and 2013, but subsequently, its share fell for two straight years, to 22.0 percent in fall 2015 (Figure 13). That was 7.5 percentage points above UT-Austin’s share (14.5 percent) in fall 2015, which had fallen from 20.1 percent in fall 2009. Other public universities increased their share from 59.7 percent to 64.4 percent between fall 2009 and 2011, but then saw their share drop 8 percentage points by fall 2013 before rebounding to 63.6 percent in fall 2015, less than a percentage point below 2011’s figure.

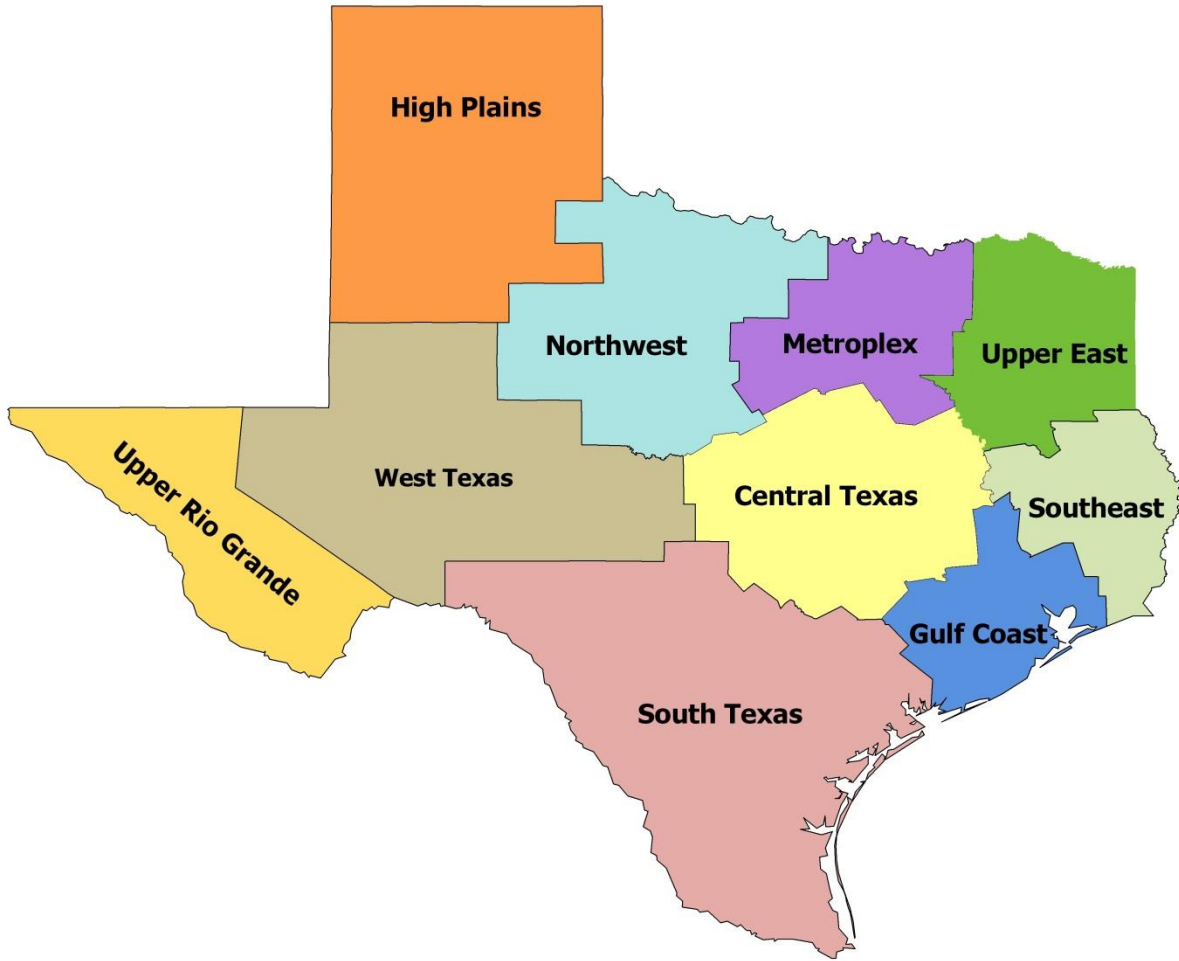
