Pre-Assessment Activity

- TSI Rule 4.55(b) requires that all testing sites provide a [Pre-Assessment Activity \(PAA\)](#) for all test takers PRIOR to test administration.
- Your district may create its own PAA, use a PAA from another Texas public institution of higher education, or email [Querium](#) to request information to use its [free PAA](#).

Computer-Adaptive

- The TSIA is an untimed, computer adaptive test administered to students online only*. The full suite of tests includes the following, which are divided by subject area (reading, writing, and mathematics):
 - Placement test (20 M/C questions that determine whether or not a student is college ready)
 - Diagnostic test (additional 30-40 M/C questions only for students who did not meet the college readiness benchmark on the Placement test)
 - Essay (impromptu, 350-500 word persuasive essay)

Testing Costs

- Cost of test is based on number of testing units used by each student
- Each unit is priced at \$1.50 (\$1.70 starting September 1, 2016)
- A student who wishes to test in all three subject areas will use up to 8 units
 - 1 unit each for reading, writing, and mathematics Placement tests
 - 1 unit each for reading, writing, and mathematics Diagnostic tests (required for each area in which the student did not meet the college readiness benchmark)
 - 2 units for each essay test
